



Outline of The Third Year Ministerial Project

The ministerial project is similar to a college thesis. It is an unstructured approach to applying what you have learned, by exercising the gift and calling that God has given you.

Step One: During the fall trimester, begin thinking about how you are being led by the Holy Spirit in an area of your calling.

Do something that challenges you in your calling.

Step Two: Begin to formalize your idea in a project proposal.

- Pray
- Dream
- Lead a discussion with others about the idea
- Take notes

Step Three: Summarize your project idea in a way that begins to answer the following questions:

A. What is your idea?

**B. How will you accomplish it? What resources are needed?
What type of help from others do you need?**

C. Where and when will the ministry take place?

Each of the following should be submitted on one page or less:

- a) Your initial proposal describes your project and how you plan to accomplish it. This is due by the last day of the Fall trimester.
- b) A subsequent writing will detail how you are implementing your idea and how the project is progressing. Bring this to the February, March or April luncheon.
- c) The last writing will be a summary of what was accomplished and what you learned. This is due before the May luncheon.

“Observe and Do” Assignment



One of the major goals of the third-year program is to move the student from being just a disciple of the Word to being a doer of the Word. Within that context, we want the student to be exposed to as many opportunities to gain experience as we can provide.

To that end, each student is required to accomplish two of the following items throughout the school year. Choose one from the Observe Column and one from the Do Column:

<u>Observe</u>	<u>Do</u>
1. Attend a Baptismal class or a Baptismal service	1. FLM Helps ministers may observe one week and do one week in their current departments
2. Attend a Baby Dedication class or a Baby Dedication service	2. Work in a Children’s Ministry class (Preschool or Grade School) two Sundays; one to observe, one to participate.
3. Attend a Music Ministry Audition	3. Work in the Storehouse Department twice (1/2 hour after Sunday am services) or once (1 hour Tuesday Afternoon)
4. Attend a funeral	4. Work with the Nursing Home ministry twice; one to observe and one to participate.
5. Attend a wedding rehearsal	5. Work on a Rebuild America project; to observe and to participate.

Documentation of Your “Observe and Do” Assignments

I. When your “Observe” assignment is completed, submit a short report (on one page or less) including:

- The name of the area of ministry that you observed.
- The date your observation was completed
- In a few sentences, describe what you learned and what God showed you.

II. When your “Do” assignment is completed, submit a short report (on one page or less) including:

- The name of the area of ministry that you did or are currently working in a part of the FLM ministry of Helps.
- The date your assignment was completed
- In a few sentences, describe what you learned and what God showed you.
