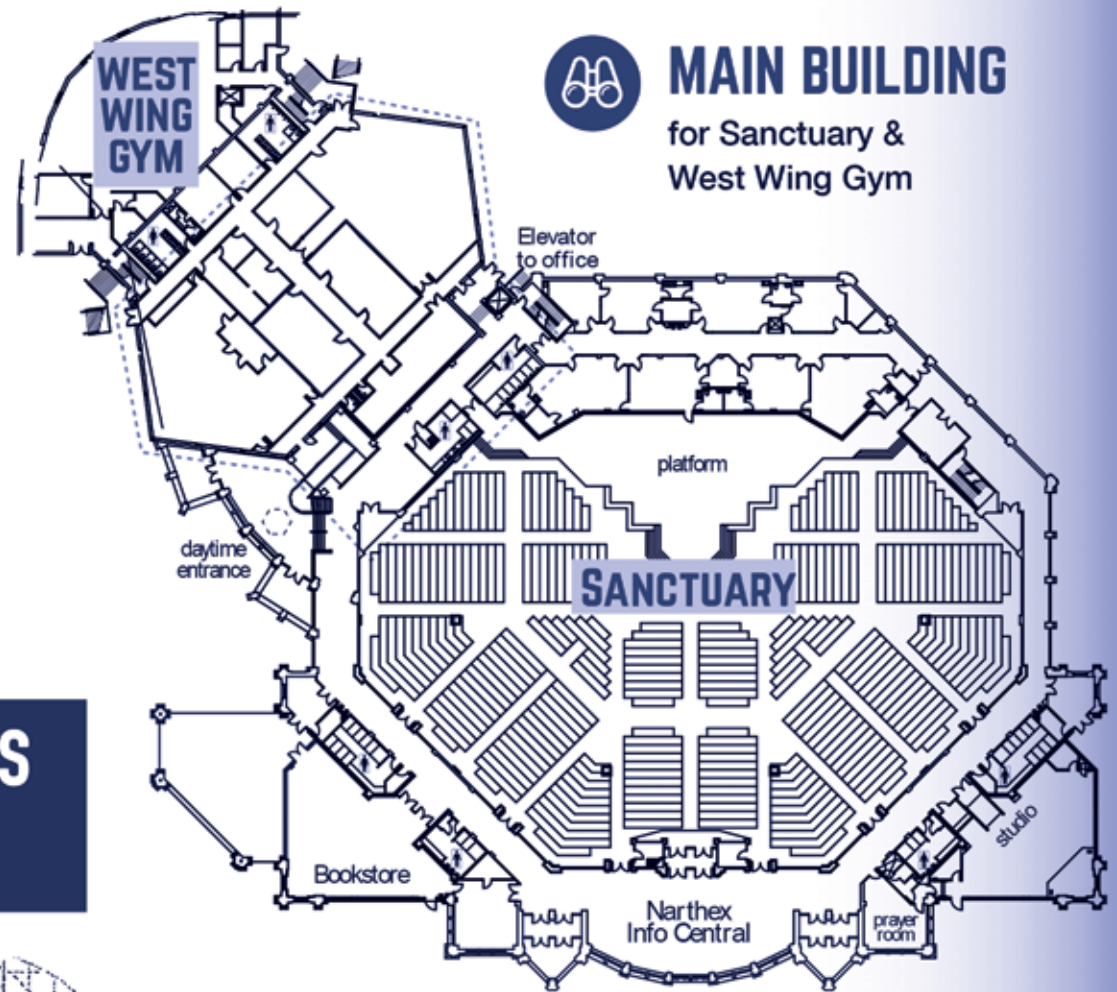

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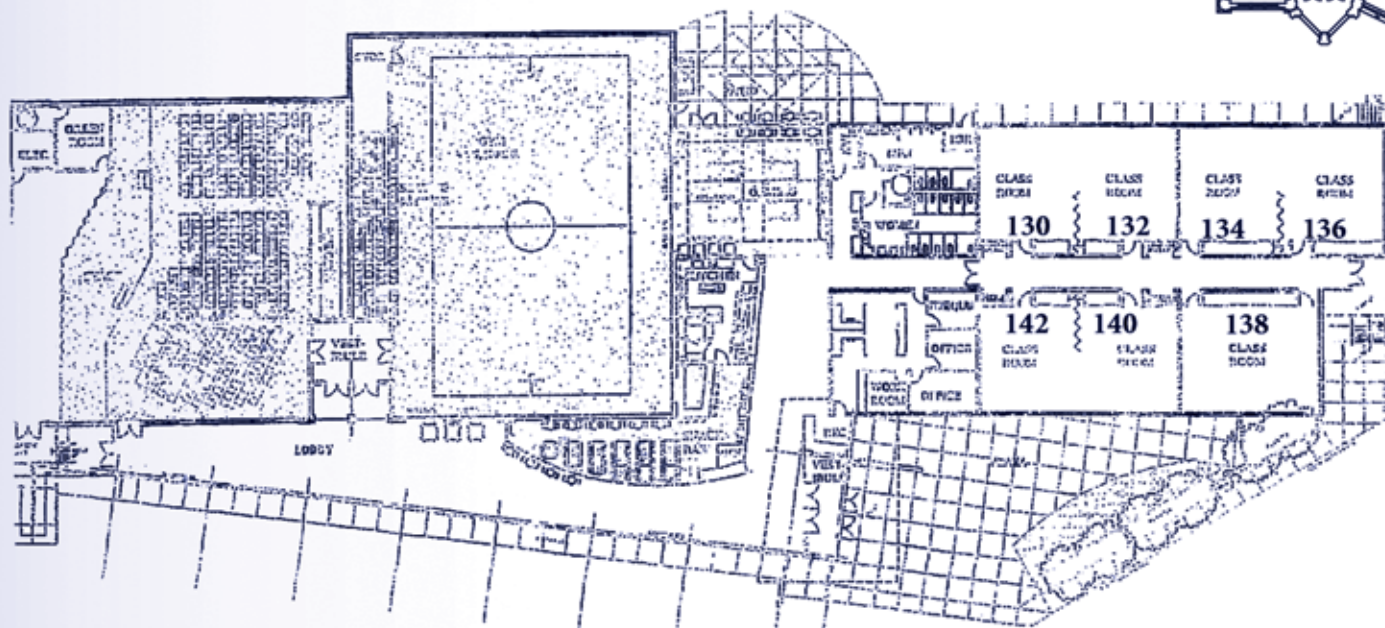

- To prepare ministers

FLBI'S ACCREDITATION



FLBI's accreditation is through The Transworld Accrediting Commission International.

For over 32 years, Transworld Accrediting Commission is an international, non-governmental, educational accrediting body, federally recognized as a non-profit church organization. Transworld has established high standards of excellence and shared Biblical Doctrine. Transworld accredits and assists theological schools, seminaries, universities, colleges, and programs throughout the world on campus, online, and distance learning.

Philosophy

Transworld's philosophy is to demonstrate accountability to the consuming public for education obtained in non-traditional evangelical educational institutions. This accountability is demonstrated by institutions that are accredited by Transworld, having documented evidence of compliance with Transworld standards of structure and governance, material resources, policies, faculty, and curriculum.

Purpose

- To provide a mechanism whereby evangelical educational institutions demonstrate that they meet at least minimal standards of performance.
- To provide consultation services that enable educational institutions to meet accepted standards of performance.
- To provide the consuming public with the current status of institutions which have applied to Transworld for accreditation.
- To provide a centralized information and referral source for issues that concern accredited institutions and non-traditional students.
- To disseminate information about non-traditional educational options to the general public.
- To promote academic excellence and accountability.





Course of Study

The basic course of study at FLBI consists of a two-year program. The first year lays the foundation, with a concentration of the basics of Christian doctrine, plus an overview of the Old and New Testaments. The second year guides the student into a deeper study of the Word of God and the practical aspects of ministry.

A certificate is awarded after successful completion of the fifteen (15) first year courses, and a diploma is awarded when the additional fifteen (15) courses from the second year program are completed successfully.

All awards also require the following two (2) qualifications:

- The student demonstrates Christian character which the school can recommend
- The student has settled all financial liabilities to the school

Students may choose to complete the two-year program using our onsite format, our online format, or our correspondence format.

FLBI Online Format

FLBI is available online! The fees, curriculum, and requirements for course credits and graduation are the same as the onsite school; but now courses may be taken at your own pace as long as the course is completed within 90 days of purchase.

FLBI Correspondence Format (for incarcerated students only)

FLBI is available through a correspondence format. The curriculum and requirements for course credits and graduation are the same as the online and onsite schools, except that there is no time limit for completion.



Entrance Requirements

The desire to serve God and fulfill His commission is the main requirement for entrance into FLBI. While we do not feel that a high school or college diploma is necessary, the course of study will require sincere commitment from the student, as well as reading and writing skills.

Application – An application form must be completed which includes the Christian Standards of Living. The application form must be submitted prior to the registration deadline.

Registration – At least two full weeks will be set aside at the beginning of each trimester for onsite course registration. Registration for onsite courses may be completed online. Registration for online courses is available on demand at flbi.org. Students failing to register during the allotted time will be charged a late fee of \$25.

Tuition and Fees – FREE - Pastor Randy Gilbert, the Founder and President of Faith Landmarks Bible Institute has declared a moratorium on fees and tuition for the 2026-2027 school year, in an effort to promote the school and make in-depth Bible training available to everyone.

Scholarships are available for full and part-time students, veterans, active-duty military, and first responders. Contact the Registrar for details.

Auditing of onsite classes is allowed for graduates. We reserve the right to limit audits based upon space availability.

Transfers - FLBI accepts the transfer of credits from other institutions. Contact the Registrar for details.

GRADING

All students are required to maintain a minimum of 2.0 grade point average in order to qualify for a certificate or a diploma. If a student maintains a 2.0 grade point average, a grade of D will be acceptable for successful completion of a course. A grade of F is not acceptable for the completion of a course for graduation.

The grading system is as follows:

Incomplete Policy

A grade of "Incomplete" is given when a student has not completed all the requirements for the course before it concludes or when a student has not fulfilled the attendance requirements for the course.

Repeating a Course

When a student fails to successfully complete a course required for graduation (due to an "Incomplete", a failing grade, or an overall grade point average less than 2.0), the course must be retaken to graduate. Failing grades will remain on the student's transcript and will affect their final grade point average.

Grading Errors

Students receive report cards at the end of each trimester. It is the student's responsibility to report any grading errors to the registrar's office in a timely manner. If no errors are reported within five weeks following the receipt of the report card, the registrar's office will assume that all records are accurate.

Add/Drop Policy

In order to drop a class, the Registrar must be notified. It is not sufficient to notify the instructor only. Forms for dropping a class are available and must be filled out and submitted to the Registrar prior to withdrawing from the class. Refunds on tuition will only be made on a pro-rated basis for class time not attended up through the fourth week of classes. When adding a class, the student must follow the same procedures as above. However, the completed form must be approved by the Registrar prior to the student's attendance of that class.

Extensions — for onsite school only

It is the responsibility of the student to complete all exams and special assignments within the time specified. If, due to circumstances beyond the student's control, exams or special assignments cannot be completed by the required date, the student may request an extension through the Registrar in writing. All requests will be reviewed by the FLBI administration. However, any request for an extension must be made by the student, in writing, prior to the class in which an exam or special assignment is due. No consideration will be given after the date that the exam or special assignment is due. This could result in failure of such class.

Attendance Policy – for onsite school only

Each course will consist of ten (10) class sessions. We expect students to attend all classes, however, two (2) absences may be allowed in order to still receive a passing grade. Three (3) absences for any particular course may disqualify students from receiving graduation credit for that course. Attendance records will be kept by the Registrar.

Tardiness – for onsite school only

It is our desire that each class begin on time. To that end, a student is considered tardy once the instructor begins teaching the material. Two (2) tardies will be considered an absence. A tardy is also recorded when a student leaves class prior to dismissal by the instructor.

Graduation Policy

To participate in a Graduation Ceremony, first and second year students are required to submit a graduation application by February 1st and to pay all required fees by March 1st. All online courses needed for graduation must be completed by May 1st. Graduation fees are non-refundable. Students who have paid graduation fees but fail final exams will not be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony.

Classroom Etiquette

ONSITE:

In order to obtain the most desirable atmosphere for receiving instruction, we ask all students to observe the following guidelines:

- No food or drink is allowed in class.
- Neither guests nor children are allowed in class.
- Students should not "chat" with other students during class.
- For questions, please raise your hand and wait for acknowledgement from the instructor.
- Turn off sound and vibration on all cell phones and electronic devices.

ONLINE:

- Students are expected to report any technical issues with online courses to the Registrar in a timely manner.
- All lessons in a course must be viewed in their entirety to receive full credit for the course.
- Fast-forwarding through a lesson, you have not viewed in its entirety, is a violation of the attendance policy and may result in a grade of "incomplete".



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STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

We believe that all students of FLBI are **called by God** to be here, and we, the faculty and staff, want to assist in any way that we can. But **YOU**, as a student, also have responsibilities. These few, simple guidelines will help you as you go through the program.

- Spend time everyday reading your Bible and in prayer. The course of study should not replace your personal time with the Lord.
- Attend Orientation.
- Be on time to class, and don't miss any classes if at all possible. This is your anointed time with the Holy Spirit.
- Take good notes in class.
- Pay your tuition bills on time or talk to the registrar.
- Keep files on each class and your grade sheets. This will help you plan your course of study from year to year.
- Review course outlines thoroughly and consistently, during each course session. (2 Timothy 2:15)
- Notify the registrar of changes to your contact information.
- Stay informed of changes that may affect programs and requirements by reading emails and listening to announcements from the Registrar's office.

LICENSURE



Graduation from FLBI with a Certificate or Diploma does not automatically qualify students to teach or to begin a licensed profession. Students interested in teaching should seek licensure through their appropriate state department (In Virginia: Department of Teacher Education and Licensure).

Students interested in a **professional license** should seek licensure through the appropriate state office, circuit court, or county/city licensing agency that handles licensure for that profession.

BIBLE DOCTRINE – 1ST YEAR

DOCT1101 - Blood Covenant

Description: To bring a working, biblical knowledge of the Blood Covenant into view for practical application by a believer.

DOCT1102 - Realities of Redemption

Description: Covers vital specifics of redemption, which is important to all believers.

DOCT1103 - Dynamics of Healing

Description: To lay the scriptural foundation for healing available to New Testament believers; to teach the use of faith as the means of walking in divine health.

DOCT1104 - Righteousness

Description: To lay the scriptural foundation of man's need for righteousness, and God's means of providing righteousness for man.

DOCT1105 - Faith by Line & Precept

Description: This course will provide the student with a complete study of faith, from both the Old and New Testaments, so that one can gain an understanding of the significance of living by faith as a Christian and as a minister of the Gospel.

DOCT1106 - The Ministry of the Holy Spirit

Description: The purpose of this course is to teach the student about the mission and the operation of the Holy Spirit in the earth and to the Church.

DOCT1107 - Spiritual Warfare

Description: Instructs and guides a believer in spiritual warfare from a novice position, all the way to "comfortable veteran."

DOCT1108 - The Making of a Champion

Description: We tend to view champions as legends and heroes, but humanity falls short of God's expectations. In this course, learn how God's expectations were met through Jesus and how we can follow Jesus' pattern.

BIBLE DOCTRINE – 2ND YEAR

DOCT2101 - Financial Redemption

Description: Biblical foundation for deliverance from Poverty. Keys to living in Abundance.

DOCT2102 - Forgiveness & Judgment

Description: To teach the student about God's divine mercy and forgiveness through the saving grace of the Lord Jesus Christ.

DOCT2103 - Ministry of Christ

Description: Using Biblical topics to detail the Ministry of Jesus Christ in all aspects.

DOCT2104 - The New Man

Description: To provide a scriptural base, in a teaching format, for the Pauline Revelation, instruct in the practicality of "walking in the New Man", and illustrate from the New Testament "what God hath wrought in Christ."

DOCT2105 - Servanthood

Description: To obtain a Biblical understanding of servanthood, and to learn the difference between slavery and service.

DOCT2106 - New Testament Prayer

Description: To instill a biblically based, New Testament basis, for successful prayer life.

DOCT2107 - The Christian Family

Description: To teach the student about God's plan for the family. It emphasizes the significance of submitting the whole family to the Word.

DOCT2108 - Blood Secrets

Description: To present an accurate doctrinal exposé of the biblical truth concerning Blood.

BIBLE PRACTICUM – 1ST YEAR

PRAC1101 - Following Jesus

Description: To lay a biblical foundation for the student, and all believers, to make right choices.

PRAC1102 - New Testament Living

Description: To instill biblical truths and practical implementation on lifestyle for believers.

PRAC1103 - God's Will for Your Financial Life

Description: To lay a scriptural foundation for a believer's life.

BIBLE PRACTICUM – 2ND YEAR

PRAC2101 - Practicalities of the Ministry

Description: To impart a general scriptural understanding of the practical and natural side of the ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ.

PRAC2102 - Helps Ministry

Description: To fully develop a scriptural understanding of Helps Ministry.

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BIBLE SURVEY – 1ST YEAR

SURV1101 - New Testament Survey

Description: A concise overview of each book of the New Testament; designed to expand the student's concept of the complete work that Jesus began here on the earth.

SURV1102 - Eschatology

Description: To teach the scriptural truth of the end times, emphasizing the time of the Rapture of the church through the establishment of the New Jerusalem. The course includes both doctrinal and chronological elements, as presented in the Bible.

SURV1103 - Old Testament Survey – Pentateuch & History

Description: This is a survey course designed to present an overview of each Old Testament book from Genesis through Esther, and how they relate to each other and how they relate to you as a Christian.

SURV1104 - Old Testament Survey – Poetry & Prophets

Description: This is a survey course designed to present an overview of each Old Testament book from Job through Malachi, how they relate to each other, and how they relate to you as a Christian.

SURV1105 - Study of Romans

Description: To instill an appreciation for great Bible truth. (It is said in literary circles that the Book of Romans ranks at the top of works done by man. We know it to be given by Inspiration of the Holy Ghost.)

SURV2101 - Study of Hebrews

THEO2105 - Ministerial Training

Description: To lay a biblical foundation of ministerial training for believers intent on fulfilling their calling in the Body of Christ.
